


to DIN 13164-B.

The DIN 13 164-compliant contents are clearly arranged in a fold-away bag with 6 sections and can be taken out easily.

For protection during delivery the first-aid box is sealed up in a transparent film.

The use-by date of the sterile products is indicated on a sticker. The first-aid material should always be kept up to date and checked at regular intervals, especially in Germany, where

providing first-aid is a legal obligation.
